### LIFE AT MANOR LAKES SET TO GET MORE CONVENIENT

Exciting times ahead for Manor Lakes residents with the recent announcement by Ranfurlie Asset Management that construction on the planned Stage 2 expansion of Manor Lakes Central shopping centre will commence shortly.

Shoppers will be impressed by the new-concept 5200m<sup>2</sup> Kmart store, featuring defined product areas, a central self-serve checkout that creates a clutter-free store entry and wider aisles for easy pram and wheelchair access.

A scheduled refurbishment of the existing centre will be completed in time for the Stage 2 opening in early-2020, resulting in a seamless and complementary connection between old and new.

Around 300 construction jobs and more than 400 on-going full and part-time retail positions will be generated by the project.

Ranfurlie Asset Management is confident the proposed retail offering will attract new visitors to Manor Lakes Central and benefit the local community.

According to Ranfurlie Asset Management CEO Mark Wilson, the company's objective is to enhance the Manor Lakes town centre by delivering an active shopping experience where people can enjoy spending time with family and friends.

"Alfresco dining spaces will link light-filled indoor and outdoor public areas and connect to landscaped communal spaces and kids' activity zones, complete with bike tracks and mini climbing walls," said Mr Wilson.

"Stage 2 of Manor Lakes Central will incorporate several family friendly elements including the very latest design in parent rooms, dedicated community areas, modern amenities and children's interactive play areas, along with free in-centre Wi-Fi."

To support increased traffic to the area, 500 new parking spaces will be constructed, taking total parking capacity to 860 cars.

#### MANOR LAKES ROTARY FUN RUN – SUNDAY 17 MARCH 2019

Manor Lakes was once again a proud sponsor of the hugely popular Wyndham Rotary Fun Run/Walk, with proceeds going to buy equipment for the Werribee Mercy Hospital Critical Care Unit.

The Werribee Mercy Hospital Critical Care Unit will provide families in Melbourne's west with surgical and critical care services closer to home. The build will include an eight-bed critical care unit, 56 new inpatient beds, six additional operating theatres, and a new central sterile supply department.

This year, the fun run attracted more than 650 registrations, which follows a scenic course along the Werribee River trail. With a range of course lengths to cater for runners and walkers of all abilities, entrants were able to sign up for a five or 10 kilometre run, or a four and eight kilometre walk. Younger kids also enjoyed the day with a 1,500m run for children 12 and under and a 400m run for children 6 other.

Rotarian Sue Selleck says the event continues to grow every year.

"Part of the day's success is the popularity of the kids' activities like face painting and balloon creations which make for a great family day out, all for a good cause," Sue explained.



"Younger entrants are invited to come along dressed as superheroes for the 400 metre or 1500 metre run depending on age, which makes for a sense of fun that carries across the entire day."

Thank you to everyone that participated in the event and Approximately \$40,000 was raised from local business sponsorship and registrations.
