

MANOR LAKES STUDENT FINDING HIS IDENTITY THROUGH ART

Talented young Manor Lakes artist John Mathet recently won the People's Choice Award at the Wyndham Art Prize for the second successive year.

The 19-year-old feels extremely honoured and humbled to have received the \$2,500 prize for the second time as a result of this year's repeat success.

"To receive the first award was amazing but to win it again this year was unbelievable," he says.

John's winning entry this year was a digital painting titled I.D.E.N.T.I.T.Y., a work which drew its inspiration from a story from his childhood in South Sudan as the youngest of a family of seven children.

"Before I left to come to Australia, one of my relatives who was wishing me well and passing on his prayers told me to never forget my identity," he explains.

"It was a very strong and powerful statement but being young and excited I didn't fully understand the meaning of what he was saying until a few years ago when I was much older. I now try to teach younger kids about what it actually means to know your identity, to know your culture, your background."

John's personal story is a truly remarkable one.

At a young age, his large family began to be separated as civil war raged in South Sudan. By the time he was seven John had fled to a refugee camp in Kenya with his grandmother and one of his elder brother Abraham.

After spending four years in the refugee camp, John and Abraham were given the opportunity to find a better future in Australia with an uncle and aunt who had relocated to Perth with their children several years earlier.

John and Abraham joined their relatives in Perth in 2014, undertaking an intensive course in English after their arrival in order to be able to speak and write the language.

The following year, a work transfer brought their uncle to Melbourne. The family moved initially to Geelong and later Werribee, before finding a home in the Lollipop Hill in late 2017.

"It's a very peaceful place in an area that is growing fast and very diverse," he observes.

John was already attending Manor Lakes College before he moved into the estate and is now completing Year 12 in 2020. "The school has always been very encouraging of my art," he comments.

John reveals that his passion for art traces back to his childhood in South Sudan.

"I get to see a lot of passion and talent in working with young kids in my local community and trying to give them opportunities."

"I can remember watching one of my older brothers draw film characters and action heroes when I was young. That's how I first started to learn how to draw," he explains.

"When I started watching cartoons like Tom and Jerry on television, I would try to draw them in the sand at school at lunchtime or recess. I would also imitate comics from newspapers. Everything just developed from there."

John's artistic talents have progressed considerably and is equally adept at working in both conventional and digital mediums.

"My art style is based on painting portraits and capturing facial expressions. Before reaching Year 9 at school I was really just drawing for fun, but now I can actually understand my story and put that into my work. I'm trying to make people look at my art and think about the story that is behind each piece," he says.

"The tools that I work with have changed over years. At first, I was sketching with pencils. Now I can also create digital artwork using Adobe Illustrator on a tablet that I purchased with money from a scholarship that I received last year."

John is also very active in his local community, helping others explore their creativity and discover their potential.

"I was involved with programs at the Manor Lakes Community Learning Centre even before moving into the estate, but more recently I've wanted to expand my reach to an even wider area so I'm now teaching art classes and painting murals at the Wyndham CEC in Werribee," he notes.

"I get to see a lot of passion and talent in working with young kids in my local community and trying to give them opportunities." John aims to continue to follow his dreams in art, wherever they may lead.

"Art will always be in my life for sure. It's something I want to turn into a career because there's nothing better than doing what you're passionate about," he suggests.

MANOR LAKES CENTRAL MURAL DEPICTS NATIVE BACKDROP

A beautiful mural depicting the native fauna and flora of Manor Lakes has been unveiled on the new wall of the Manor Lakes Central extension.

The stunning mural designed by local artist Carissa will the soon be the backdrop to the outdoor playground and rock climbing wall now under construction. The Manor Lakes P-12 College graduate who now studies Interior Design at RMIT, used native flora and fauna to tell the tale of her upbringing in Manor Lakes. She shares her story below.

"Thoughts I kept coming back to while making this were memories of what Manor Lakes looked like in 2008 versus 2020.

Growing up directly in front of the undeveloped areas, I was used to seeing the kangaroos on the other side of the river – one even ended up in my backyard! Hence the featured Kangaroo.

Driving in and out of Manor Lakes, the cockatoo was another native animal I always saw on a sunny day on Ballan road. The placement of the cockatoo is also there to challenge the children to be active by climbing further up the rock wall; at the same time, invite parents into the external playground area and take photos of their children.

When I think of a mural, I imagine fully covered walls with graffiti-styled art with a political message or art featuring a visually overwhelming palette of colours. In my mural, I wanted to capture the simplicity of living in this western suburb, along with its comfortable lifestyle and radiant familial energy."

The artwork is such a beautiful addition to Manor Lakes Central and will be the showpiece once it is unveiled alongside the new playground for the whole community to enjoy.

MANOR LAKES CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Construction under a COVID-Safe Plan has been able to continue at Manor Lakes with construction services deemed an essential service.

Around the Lakeside precinct, the Wetlands beautification project has been progressing at a swift pace, with the boardwalk taking shape and coming to life around the lake's edge. With work continuing to progress at the current pace it is anticipated that the Wetlands will be completed by the end of the year.

The reserve situated in Stage 47, also known as Rondo Drive Reserve, was completed in July and is now open to the public for use within the current COVID-19 restrictions. This community reserve includes a playground, barbeque area accompanied by a shelter and a generous grassed kickabout area.



The long-awaited Stage 42 Reserve is now completed with Council recently approving the viewing platform, waterplay and playground. The reserve includes an expansive playground and complimented with a fun, interactive waterplay area that's sure to keep the kids amused as the weather warms up.

Construction is continuing well along Ison Road (Manor Lakes Boulevard towards Greens Road) with the road due to open by the end of 2020. The Spearmint Boulevard to Ballan Road intersection is now operational to traffic.

MANOR LAKES CENTRAL ALIVE WITH ART AND PLAYGROUNDS

Whilst current restrictions are in place throughout the centre, construction, which is deemed an essential service has been allowed to continue around Manor Lakes Central under a strict COVID-19 plan.

This has meant that both the internal and external play areas have been moving ahead in leaps and bounds and will be ready for community use in the near future, and once final Council approvals are granted, and restrictions have eased.

Many would have seen the beautiful mural designed by local resident Carissa coming to life on an external wall on the new extension. This mural, depicting Manor Lakes through the eyes of Clarissa as she grew up has now had a climbing wall incorporated. The area has been further enhanced by the creation of an external playground which sits alongside and featuring two covered sandpits, swings, slides, tunnels, interactive play panels and a sensory cubby and adventure obstacles.



The playground has been designed as a nature play environment, with the need to create a fun and inclusive play space for all.

The area has been constructed predominantly from locally sourced and environmentally friendly cypress pine and includes soft fall mulch finish with rubber matting to the base of the slides and swings. Also featuring within the playground is an all ability swing ensuring safe enjoyable access for all children within the community, plus a picnic area and shade umbrellas.

Inside the centre located in the mall near Kmart, the internal playground features a colourful array of interactive pieces for smaller aged children. The area is surrounded by a colourful picket fence and within the space children will enjoy various degrees of oversized flowers, jumping pads, tunnels, and a climbing and seating space.



Also on offer within the centre is the Community Room, which can be accessed by not for profit and local community organisations.

The Community Room is located near centre management and features a kitchenette, tables, chairs, whiteboard and is a warm and inviting space to hold meetings

or small social gatherings such as a support group or playgroup.

Due to current restrictions, the centre has been unable to officially open the room for use, however once restrictions are lifted bookings will be taken through centre management. Located in the main corridor to the amenities and centre management is the addition of a historical timeline community mural. This stunning and highly detailed mural showcases many of the important features, people and landmarks of the Manor Lakes and the surrounds community. It is certain to attract and be the discussion of many local and surrounding residents.
