MANOR LAKES COMMUNITY FUND

Twenty six not-for-profit groups working across Wyndham will share in \$33,000 to provide services and support to the local community via the Manor Lakes 2020 Community Fund grants, with the successful recipients announced in late November.

Since 2002, Dennis Family Corporation has distributed over \$750,000 to community groups across Victoria and Queensland through the annual Community Fund, with local Wyndham community groups sharing in more than \$300,000 since the Manor Lakes Community Fund was established in 2003.

"Community Funds were introduced as a practical way of giving back to the communities we create. We recognise the vital role not-for-profit groups play in connecting people and fostering a sense of belonging within our estates," said Dennis Family Group Director, Grant Dennis.

How did you hear about the Manor Lakes Community Fund?

Encompass Community Services has actually been providing disability services in Geelong for 35 years and has been providing NDIS services for the past 7 years.

It was through the NDIS that we opened our services at the Wyndham Community Centre which is how I received an email about the Community Fund.

Why did you apply for the grant?

I applied for a \$1,000 grant to support our disability arts program. The grant was used to purchase art and craft materials for our participants to use. Along with cooking, the arts program is one of our most popular programs and usually caters for up to 32 people each week.

How has the grant benefitted your clients?

The benefits of the arts program for participants are twofold – it is creative and it is calming. But this is more than just an 'activity'. I am passionate about giving our participants a voice and skills they can use. We are developing linkages with Wyndham Community Arts group and links to local artists.

It can also empower participants to engage in potential pathways for their future. If they have a real flair and enthusiasm

for what they are doing I encourage them to apply to do further training and maybe pursue a career in that field.

Participants would normally come to the Community Centre for the program, but we have had to move to online Zoom sessions just like everyone else this year.

We've focused on developing individual skills, keeping people engaged and reducing isolation. We've also had to work with materials that are readily available in the home when delivering the arts and craft program online.

What message would you like to share about the grants?

The Manor Lakes Community Fund and Dennis Family Corporation are amazing! In the middle of a pandemic, they are still giving away grants to support the people and organisations who really need it.

MANOR LAKES CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Major park and wetland beautification set to begin in Lollipop Hill!



We are excited to announce that construction work on the eagerly anticipated park and wetland developments in the Lollipop Hill precinct of Manor Lakes is set to begin in November 2020!

What can you look forward to seeing?

Stage 175 Reserve

Covering an expansive 1.14 hectares between Marmalade Road, Muscatell Crescent and Lollipop Creek, the Stage 175 Reserve development is destined to become the focal point of outdoor activities for young and old alike.

The northern entry point to the reserve features a striking entry arbour nestled amongst flowering indigenous plantings interspaced with the fibrous-flaky bark of Eucalyptus Grey Box trees. Wrapping around an expansive plateau containing seating nodes, it is an idyllic place to gather and admire the sweeping views across the reserve and the restored Lollipop Creek ecosystem.

As you stroll along the network of circulating paths you will discover a meandering dry creek situated amongst native plants and trees, containing locally sourced rocks and logs. Further enhancing the connection to site and its place alongside Lollipop Creek, the dry creek creates an adventurous pathway through the site, encouraging nature-based play as you forage and navigate your way across its undulations and natural features.

There is not a child in Lollipop Hill who won't be pleading to visit the new playground. Sheltered by shade sails and surrounded by large canopy trees, they will delight in dashing between the basket swing, carousel, slide and sensory play panels, all easily accessible via a network of ramps and stairs. For the more adventurous, the modular play structure has climbing ropes, platforms, a hydraulic DropZone elevator and a tube slide.

The reserve also accommodates more formalised sports on the half basketball court with soccer goals, as well as a cycling track for small children around the circulating pathways and large turfed kick about spaces.

When you are not playing with your friends and family in the park, you can watch and relax in the nearby shelter, or take in the sights and sounds of Lollipop Creek.





Stage 168 Wetland

The wetland system stretches across 1.79 hectares between Holyoake Parade and Ricotta Road, with over 16,000 specially selected native aquatic plants filtering stormwater run-off prior to its release into the nearby Lollipop Creek, surrounded by a further 30,000 native plants. Enjoy walking along the network of footpaths or sitting at one of the many viewing areas to experience the tranquility of the space with its plentiful plants, wildlife and open water bodies.

Timelines

With work on the Stage 175 Reserve and Stage 168 Wetland set to commence in November, we anticipate earthworks and footpath construction being completed by January early in 2021. Planting of the 46,000+ native plants is scheduled to commence thereafter.

The Wetland is expected to be open to residents by April mid-2021. We look forward to opening the Reserve space to residents in the second half of 2021.

LAKESIDE WETLANDS NEARING COMPLETION

The magnificent Lakeside wetland is now in the final stages of completion and we anticipate residents being able to enjoy peaceful sunset strolls, early morning runs and afternoon walks with the kids on their scooters along the extensive boardwalk by the end of 2020.

Covering 2.65 hectares, the wetland will feature over 70,000 plants to create a beautiful, healthy ecosystem and attract abundant birdlife.

MANOR LAKES NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH GROUP

According to Lollipop Hill resident, Chakri Chayanam, "All you need is one person to make a difference".

As the driving force behind great collaboration among the community members to establish the new Manor Lakes Neighbourhood Watch Group (NHW), Chakri is now proud to be that person making a difference in Manor Lakes!

The group was formalised on October 31 following an enormously successful preliminary meeting, hosted via Zoom on October 17.

"It was fantastic," said Chakri. "We had nearly 100 people log into the meeting and 120 people have already joined the group."

"The meeting was scheduled for one hour but lasted nearly two hours. As well as improving communication with local police and boosting the community's trust in the police, it resulted in much closer contact with our neighbours. We all have young families so we all share similar concerns."

While currently the majority of members are Lollipop Hill residents, Chakri anticipates the Manor Lakes NHW will consist of subgroups for each of the precincts – Lollipop Hill, Lakeside, Botanica and the rest of Manor Lakes – with five Area Representatives elected for each subgroup. He encourages residents in each precinct to take the lead in establishing the subgroup for their area.

Chakri commends the support of local police and the Neighbourhood Watch administrative team in helping to establish the group in Manor Lakes.

"Neighbourhood Watch has been very helpful with setting up the group and offering to assist with events in the future. We plan to hold two 'get to know your neighbour' events each year and issue fortnightly updates."

Chakri cites three reasons for establishing the Neighbourhood Watch group:

- To get to know our neighbours and build a stronger community, which makes it much easier for new families and residents to feel connected when they move into the area.
- 2. To educate residents about the key features they should include on their home to reduce the risk of crime and highlight the common mistakes people make.
- Having the easily identifiable 'Neighbourhood Watch' signs displayed throughout the estate to raise awareness of the group and send a clear message that Manor Lakes is a proactive, welcoming and connected community.

He also expressed his gratitude to Dennis Family Corporation for their support for the initiative and assistance with developing digital and printed promotional material which will soon be seen around the estate and online.

Chakri plans to hold an information session for Lakeside residents in December, while the Lollipop Hill group will meet again early in the new year.

"I will put my hand up whenever my community needs it!" he shares.

WERRIBEE ZOO UPGRADE

The State Government's announcement of an \$84 million upgrade for Werribee Open Range Zoo is great news for residents of Manor Lakes.



Along with the excitement of having elephants on our doorstep, the upgrade will boost employment and tourism in the area.

According to the Premier's media release, "the expansion will create almost 350 local jobs – including 90 direct jobs looking after animals and visitors once the exhibits are up and running – as well as increasing the number of visitors and tourists through the gates from more than 680,000 in 2018/19 to one million visitors annually".





The upgrade is also good news for the elephants, who will be relocating from Melbourne Zoo to be free to roam in a magnificent new 22-hectare elephant sanctuary.
