Construction update

Construction in Manor Lakes is picking up again after a short break over the Christmas holidays.

Landscaping works continue in the Village Wetlands with native fauna cultivated from local, indigenous spores; perimeter walking paths; and a 115 metre long boardwalk.

The Village Wetlands will open in August 2025.

Titles have been received for stages 202 and 203 in The Village precinct, along Ellisburg Street and Bloomingburg Road.

Construction for Stage 204 along Maywood Road is expected to begin in mid-March.

The pavlova is a beloved dessert, most associated with Christmas festivities in the South-Pacific.

While its origins cause a light-hearted squabble between Australians and New Zealanders, everyone can agree the pavlova is a delicious crowd-pleaser.

Summer Pavlova with seasonal fruits



Ingredients

For the base

6 eggs, store-bought and cold 1 ¼ cups caster sugar 2 tbsp cornstarch 1 tsp white vinegar 1/2 tsp vanilla extract For the topping

300ml thickened cream, refrigerated

2 tbsp icing sugar, sifted

1 mango, peeled and thinly sliced

125g strawberries, washed and diced

125g blueberries, washed

Method

Preheat your oven to 135 degrees Celsius. Grab a large sheet of parchment paper and draw a large circle (9-inch circumference) in the centre. Alternatively, you can use a silicone baking sheet. Set aside.

Place a large glass bowl in the fridge. This is important for whipping the cream topping.

Separate egg whites and egg yolks into two bowls, taking care to remove all yolk from the whites.

Beat egg whites until stiff. Gradually add caster sugar, 1 tablespoon at a time, beating well after each. Once all sugar is added, beat meringue until thick, glossy, and opaque.

Fold in cornstarch, vanilla extract, and vinegar.

Add the meringue mixture to the baking paper circle, careful to lightly lift the mixture into a cake-like shape.

Bake in the preheated oven for 1 hour. The pavlova should be dry and sound hollow when lightly tapped. Let cool completely on a wire rack, before carefully transferring to a serving plate.

Add thickened cream to the refrigerated bowl and beat with an electric or hand whisk until stiff peaks form (cream clings to whisk and peaks stand straight).

Cover the meringue with the whipped cream.

Next, layer mango, strawberries, and blueberries to your taste.





Three town homes, two sons, one family

Kim and Brian, parents from St Albans, along with their two sons, Nathan and Matthew, are gearing up to get the keys to three brand-new town homes in Manor Lakes.



Having nothing when you're a teenager to having a car fully paid off and now owning your first home — it's a big step," Nathan explained.

Matthew also shares the mix of excitement and nerves as he steps into homeownership. "I mean, for my age, it's pretty unexpected," Matthew said. "Having a look around and seeing how much rent is and how expensive everything is getting nowadays, I think it's good that I've got in early."

Kim sees the challenges but can't help the feelings of pride. "It's a massive step for them, for their age. So, we're definitely very, very proud parents," she said. "We've always instilled in them that you get what you work for, and they both have a very good work ethic."

		Beach safety tips Remember to be careful—Surf lifesaving clubs are not patrolling all beaches. Given the position of Victoria's coastline our beaches can be dangerous. Even with surf lifesaving clubs at many of the popular beaches, surfers are warning and saving thousands of people each year at more secluded beaches.
		If you're visiting a beach for the first time, ask a local about the conditions before you get in. Where possible, swim between the flags. Summer Safety—Surf Lifesaving Victoria.
		Don't forget to slip, slop, slap when out enjoying the sun. Slip on a top, slop on some sunscreen, slap on a hat, seek some shade and slide some sunglasses on.
